Arend J. Meerburg has an MSc in nuclear reactor physics from the University of Technology in Delft (1964). He worked some years in oceanography and meteorology (including in the Antarctic). Meerburg joined the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in 1970 and worked there until retirement in 2004. Most of that period he was involved in multilateral arms control matters, including the final negotiations in Geneva of the Chemical Weapons Convention and the Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty. He was involved in many NPT-matters, the International Nuclear Fuel Cycle Evaluation (INFCE), discussions on an International Plutonium Storage regime (IPS), the Nuclear Suppliers Group etc. He also served as ambassador to Yemen (1996-2000). Around 2005 he was member of the IAEA expert-group on Multilateral Nuclear Approaches to sensitive parts of the fuel cycle. At present he is member of the International Panel on Fissile Materials, working on issues related to a future treaty to cut-off the production of fissile materials for weapons purposes.
