William Walker has been Professor of International Relations at the University of St Andrews in Scotland since 1996, having previously worked at the Science Policy Research Unit, University of Sussex. A graduate of Edinburgh University, his main research and writing have been on international nuclear politics. His many publications include, with David Albright and Frans Berkhout, *Plutonium and Highly Enriched Uranium: World Inventories, Capabilities and Policies* (1997), the first global survey of nuclear weapon-related materials; *Nuclear Entrapment: THORP and the Politics of Commitment* (1999); with Malcolm Chalmers, *Uncharted Waters: The UK, Nuclear Weapons and the Scottish Question* (2001); 'Nuclear Enlightenment and Counter-Enlightenment', *International Affairs*, May 2007; *A Perpetual Menace: Nuclear Weapons and International Order* (2012); and with Nicholas Wheeler, 'The Problem of Weak Nuclear States', *The Nonproliferation Review*, November 2013.
